

### RESIDENT/FELLOW BENEFITS AND ADMINISTRATIVE CONTENT

#### A. Resident/Fellow Benefits

## B. Department of Psychiatry Book/Scholarly Fund

- 1. Each resident is provided funds by the department (\$2000 for resident/fellows). \$1000 additional funds are provided for chief resident/chief fellow for books or other educational expenses including to attend conferences. If there are two chief fellows for the year, this amount will be divided \$500/each.
- 2. Funds must be used in the academic year in which they were received, and any unused funds do not "rollover" into the next academic year.

## C. Supplies and Equipment

- 1. Most ordinary supplies are provided by the department.
- 2. Any additional requests for office supplies should be made to the program director
