A. Resident/Fellow Benefits

B. Department of Psychiatry Book/Scholarly Fund

1. Each resident is provided funds by the department (\$2000 for resident/fellows). \$1000 additional funds are provided for chief resident/chief fellow for books or other educational expenses including to attend conferences. If there are two chief fellows for the year, this amount will be divided \$500/each.
2. Funds must be used in the academic year in which they were received, and any unused funds do not “rollover” into the next academic year.

C. Supplies and Equipment

1. Most ordinary supplies are provided by the department.
2. Any additional requests for office supplies should be made to the program director

D. Policy on Accepting Gifts from the Pharmaceutical Industry
